

16: If God Made the Universe, Then Who Made God?

FB: Everything in the physical universe is the *effect* of some other *cause*. Nothing we can see, touch, taste, hear, or smell just pops into existence from nowhere. If everything in the universe has been caused by something else, then we must look outside the universe to find the cause of it all—the first and uncaused cause. After all, the chain of causes has to end somewhere in the past, or else it would stretch back forever. We know that’s impossible in a universe that had a beginning to its existence. FB: The Bible teaches that the Uncaused Cause of our universe is God. Colossians 1:16 says of God the Son that “For everything was created by Him, in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things have been created through Him and for Him.” God is the ultimate Cause that sets all other causes and effects into motion. He is *supernatural*, meaning He exists outside the natural universe and isn’t governed by natural laws. Hence, God doesn’t need a cause for His existence. Asking the question, “Who made God?” is similar to asking the question, “What does an invisible man look like?” By definition, a man who is invisible cannot be seen. If I ask what he looks like, I’m asking a question that changes his nature of invisibility. Once I change his nature, he is no longer the thing I’m asking about. In other words, if an invisible man looked like *anything*, he would no longer be invisible. By definition, God is uncaused.
